HISTORY

"Give me the equivalent of the S&P 500!"

- Established in 1982, formed specifically to respond to institutional investors needs for a measure of real estate performance
- Beginnings date back to the mid-1970s
 - Pension funds first began allocating capital to private commercial real estate
- Formed as a not-for-profit industry association with specific objective:
 - To develop a standard measure of investment performance reporting on privately-owned commercial real estate assets owned in a fiduciary environment

HISTORY

- Initial support by Frank Russell Company and 14 real estate investment managers
 - NPI start date: December 31, 1977
 - Number of properties: 233
 - Market value: \$580.9 Million
- Today, membership includes institutional investors, real estate investment managers, consultants, academics, CPAs and other service providers
 - NPI: Fourth Quarter 2024
 - Number of Properties: 12,767
 - Market Value: \$893 Billion

WHERE IS NCREIF NOW?

- Number of Members: Approximately 150 Data Contribution Members; 95 Plan Sponsors (Investors); 200 Professional; 60 Academic
- Size of the Database: Approximately 40,000 Unique Properties; Over \$800B Total Current Asset Value
- Data Elements Collected: Over 60 Property Fields and Over 100 Fund Fields Collected Quarterly
- Number of Indexes and Universes Published: Over 25 Official Indexes/Measures Produced Quarterly
- **Education Program:** Over 750 industry professionals have enrolled in the NCREIF Academy, and 50 have completed the Professional Certificate Program


EDUCATION PROGRAM - NCREIF ACADEMY
